# **Principal's Highlights**

Carson Middle School teachers, staff, and parents work together to ensure a positive and safe educational experience for all of our students.

- CMS placed 18 students in the NZMEA Honor Band.
- CMS implemented school-wide mobile 1:1 laptop devices for each student and teacher.
- CMS implemented student led conferences for all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students and parents.
- CMS 7th and 8th grade boys basketball, 8th grade girls volleyball, and 8th grade boys cross country teams were crowned Tah-Neva League champions.
- Over 220 students participated in "S-Club," a rewards program for high achieving students.
- Over 150 students participated in "Solon Pride," our after school program targeting intervention and enrichment activities for at-risk students.
- CMS Implementation Specialists supported all department and grade level PLC's through implementing the Learner Centered Model.

This process will include building systems for identifying student success while providing intervention and remediation opportunities for students on a regular and ongoing basis. This process will include looking at developing both academica and college ready skills for all students.

## **School Communication Efforts**

Carson Middle School believes that parent communication is essential to student success. We communicate with our parents in both English and Spanish to ensure parents receive information. Our teaching staff posts assignments and grades via PowerSchool to communicate academic progress. Grades are available in real-time online. Phone Messenger is utilized on a regular basis to inform parents of upcoming events, special bulletins, and student attendance.

Our parent/staff newsletter "C-Notes" is distributed bi-monthly. Family engagement events are held every month to increase family involvement and engagement. CMS hosted an annual Open House, Family Fun Night, Science Night, Veteran's Day Memorial, Career Day, and mock job interviews to involve our entire community. Our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) is very active in supporting our school and meets on a monthly basis.
